

BEESWAX CLOTHS

They protect the sandwhich, guard fruit remains and cover bowls and dishes safely - beeswax cloths are true all-rounders. They not only help to avoid plastic packaging or aluminum foil, they even have an antibacterial effect due to the beeswax. And best of all, they're easy to make.

That's what you need



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Here's how it's done



1. Cut the fabric to the desired size with pinking shears. The pinking shears will keep the fabric from fraying.

2. Heat the wax in a water bath until it melts.



3. Add one tablespoon of coconut oil and mix it together



4. Place the cloth on a baking paper underlay and apply beeswax to the cloth with the silicone brush



5. Place the baking paper on the ironing pad, place the beeswax cloth on top and place another layer of baking paper on top so that the cloth is covered with baking paper on both sides.



6. Iron (cotton setting) until the wax, which is now liquid again, is evenly distributed on the cloth

- 7. Remove the baking paper
- 8. Put the cloth aside to dry

Done!

Rinse the beeswax cloth only with a damp cloth or under running water. Do not put it in the dishwasher!

The cloth can be used for about a year and can then be treated again with beeswax for further use.
